## Heart Shapes – October, 2018 The Shape of Leaders and Followers

When I was a child, my brothers and sisters and friends would play a game called "Follow the Leader." Each player was to follow and mimic the actions of the one who was "it." We followed the leader as best we were able with the hope to be chosen to be the leader and have our turn to show the way. To play the game, it took both the leader who stepped up to lead and the participants would follow performing the various actions. Both were key roles

Our biblical scriptures tell stories of both leadership and followers and what it takes to be both. Old Testament prophets followed the leading of God, knowing full well that they would pay the price of becoming unpopular with most of the people that they would proclaim God's word. The prophets were loyal to follow God's calling despite their own comfort and demands that they might encounter.

We hear the stories of the men and women who left their homes when they heard Jesus say "Follow me". Ordinary people stepped out of routine life and trusted the One who called. Each step they took to follow Jesus, they were open to learn and grow into their own leadership to continue sharing and living as Jesus showed them. to remind ourselves at this time that leadership is not given lightly nor should it be accepted without a sense of dedication to the task.

All of us have been called to be leaders when we accepted the name of "Christian". But today, the risks are not nearly so great as they were before, at least not in the United States. It is good to remind ourselves at this time that leadership is not given lightly nor should it be accepted without a sense of dedication to the task.

Within our own community of faith, we recognize the potential for leadership that exists among young and old in age, as well as, those who those who are new to our church family and those that have been around for a while. So often we tap the leader resources of our "old" and ignore our "young".

As we live into being "dynamic faith community", may we recognize, identify and nurture our youth to be leaders "in prophetic, redemptive and reconciling ministries to the whole world." © Disciples Home Mission.

But more than that, we all need to acknowledge our need to follow the leader who is Christ, who came that we might have life and have it abundantly. All Saints Day is a tradition in the Christian community of acknowledging the loss of loved ones, remembering their relationship with us and releasing to God their presence from earth but not from our hearts. Although we remember all of our loved ones, we name out loud those who have died since our last All Saints Day. This year our service will include the dedication of a wooden and iron bench made by one of our youth members, Kinsey Patrick. This bench will be dedicated as a place of welcome in our gardens to the memory of Teresa Harris Guthrie. We will also include the dedication of the upstairs room that has been renovated by Property Committee. This room will be dedicated as a place of gathering and welcome and learning in our building to the memory of Mrytice Kilpatrick. Our blessings are many because of these women and others who led us and followed the calling of Christ.

Our hearts remain tender with the loss of our loved ones. Our minds are full with My hope is that we will always have memory. tender hearts, willing to love and be kind and do courageous acts that inspire us and others to be loving people. This past year has been demanding following the loss of too many of our loved ones. Individually and together, we keep going as we heal from the woundedness of loss. Each one of us are on individual journeys of grief, while at the same time connected and together in our Each one of us handles the journey in our own way. And each loved one is important to our being and significant to our shaping. We look for ways to remember and to express ourselves and our love.

Some of us write about our journey. Some of us take solitary walks and reflect. Some stay busy with tasks and 'to-do' list to accomplish. Some shed tears at the most inconvenient times. Some go to the beach and hear the ocean or the river to follow the flow. Some sit in silence. Some move

on quickly, others more slowly. Some play softball inspired by those that have gone before. Some write poetry. Some build with their hands and create new images. Some run and run and run. All of us grieve.

As your minister, I have marveled with appreciation for this journey we are on. for signs that healing is taking place. I hope that the wounds are not too deep nor too devastating I think we have conquered the beast of anger and then it arises again. I watch for complacency when the pain seems too much. I listen for God's still small voice to comfort and I pray that we move forward through to where God might lead us in ways not yet imagined. Every day holds both the chaos and the orderliness of something new being created. look forward to next year and where we might find ourselves. But, today is the day to live and be. I share the following two photos to give comfort and to give inspiration as we live into each day connecting with each other and loving all we encounter.

The photos are from two places of memory for Teresa. The metal bench is located at UGA outside the building where she worked. The community of UGA honored her memory with a bench of welcome and a scholarship fund for investing in future leaders such as Teresa. UGA has a public express of the respect and inspiration of Teresa. FCCW will have our own bench of welcome and rest. The flowers were left on the day of the half marathon in Athens by loved ones who ran the race inspired by her memory.



The second photo is more individual and quieter in response. Lucy Hunt remembers Teresa with the initials – THG on her cleats and on her glove. She holds these two pieces of equipment near to her as she plays a game that Teresa played. Lucy grabs hold of her glove, practices with gusto and plays with passion. She is determined to play college ball. Teresa is still part of Lucy's journey of playing and becoming a young woman. I admire Lucy for acting to quietly proclaim the importance of relationship and determination to be in the present and still remember with love.



We will find additional ways to remember and to honor all of our loved ones who have passed from our presence into God's hands. Each person is important. Together, we will move forward through this hard time. I have taken comfort in the song that Willie Nelson has recently released—it goes like this:

When you lose the one you love, you think your world has ended, you think your world will be a waste of life without them in it.

You feel there's no way to go on, Life is just a sad, sad song, but love is bigger than us all, the end is not the end at all.

It is not something you get over, but it's something you get through.

It's not ours to be taken, it's just a thing we get to do.

Life goes on and on, and when it's gone, it lives in someone new.

It's not something you get over but its something you get through.

#### Dear Fellow WFCC Worshippers,

When the Stewardship & Finance Committee last wrote to you in the Chalice it was to announce this year's giving campaign, Growing In Grace. Now, as the annual congregational meeting approaches, we want to give you an update and assist you with information as you think about your personal giving to the church for the coming year.

The committees and other budget entities all submitted their budget requests to us in September. We are grateful for their timely responses and for the thoughtful and thorough efforts reflected in the requests. As our committee reviewed the submissions we knew our task was more than "number crunching". We viewed our mission as the first step in converting the gifts from you into into actions by WFCC to do God's work in the world.

When our committee worked to develop a budget recommendation for Board approval we confronted financial restraints that required adjustments. Each of our change recommendations was an attempt to create a budget that was financially realistic and responsible while not lessening the good our church's expenditures would accomplish.

The Board received and reviewed the recommended budget and approved it at their October meeting. This budget is attached for your consideration and understanding. It will be presented for a vote at the congregational meeting on November 18. When we meet as a congregation we will describe the "before and after" regarding changes made by the Stewardship & Finance Committee. You will see that the 2019 budget amount is virtually the same as our current budget. But you will also see that additional effort and generosity will be needed if we are to meet our giving and budget goals in the future.

The budget submitters, our committee, and the Board, are presenting the product of the budget development to you, the congregation. It is now in all of our hands. May we all prayerfully consider the budget and our individual contributions as we attempt to Grow In Grace.
