The Shape of Redemption

February is a month that is short but powerful. We start with Groundhog Day and a prediction tool that sets our hopes toward spring or dashes our expectations to more winter! Brrr! In the middle of the month, it is all 'hearts' with the symbols of Valentine's Day – a day to remind us of love. At the end of the month, it turns us toward the practice and patience of Lent with Fat Tuesday or Mardi Gras moving quickly to Ash Wednesday. A new journey begins toward the glory of Easter. And so, time passes quickly.

The calendar and schedule move us along through busy, full lives. Yet, our faith reminds us to take a moment of time along the way to listen openly and to respond simply to that still small voice of the Holy One. We are called back to a place and an attitude of love and a practice of praying that re-shapes us, re-energizes us, redeems us.

The experience of redemption comes to mind when we practice the habit of praying. The Old Testament understanding of redemption involves deliverance from bondage that is based on the payment. God has taken the initiative to act compassionately on those who are powerless to help themselves. God brings us back to reclaim the broken pieces and to heal. In the practice of prayer, we are shaped by the experience of receiving from God's loving presence when we open up our quietest reflections and our deepest confidences. The shape of redemption is a slow moving into the unknown. Redemption is claim in relationship to God and to one another. A habitual prayer time allows for our hearts to listen in a different way than the world would project.

Listen to the wise counsel of some writers who practiced the act of praying for the purpose of being reclaimed and healed:

"The desert fathers and mothers believed that prayer was a disposition of wholeness, so that "prayer and our life must be all of a piece" Diana Butler Bass

"Teach your mouth to say what is in your heart." Abba Poemen

"Eastern Orthodox tradition have described prayer as bringing your thinking down into your heart. Love lives and thrives in the heart space. Keeping these images in the heart is transformative. Next time a resentment, negativity, or irritation come into your mind, move that thought or person literally into your heart space." Richard Rohr

The path of redemption is shaped by our minds connected to the depths of our hearts. May we in this new season of faithfulness, practice the gifts of the heart, shaped through the claim of redemption that beacons us to be whole people of God. I look forward to the next days with you on our journey together. May we start with this Call to Worship – individually and corporately:
