Advent is upon us – starting on the last Sunday in November seemed too early. We have barely eaten the foods of Thanksgiving before this new season of preparation and expectation is upon us! Taking our time to walk a path of reclaiming Christ and renewing our spirits is almost impossible to imagine. We hit the ground running toward the day of Christmas to come!

Perhaps our experience of preparation and expectation is much like the story Luke describes of Mary, Joseph and the Christ Child. The first steps started a journey of unknowns.

When the angel visited Mary and shared the news that she was chosen by God to carry a child that would be Jesus, she first responded in disbelief and resistance. The impossible was now her responsibility and possibility and she accepted willingly.

When Joseph first heard the news that Mary was pregnant with child that he would raise as his own, he first retreated to the tradition of rejection and protection of his betrothed. The difficulty and shameful was now his calling to continue to love and protect his Mary and the child she carried. And he willingly embrace the opportunity.

When they traveled as a couple to Bethlehem to follow the law of the land, they discovered the journey was the beginning of many twists and turns of unpredictable situations. They slept in a barn like cave because there was no room for them, only a manger of hay for their child. And they welcomed visitors from around the world to their humble room to worship and adore their child.

Each part of the story of Christ's birth tells the unexpected and the unplanned to become a moment of possibility and responsibility. They followed the still small yet encouraging voice of God. What was hoped for and imagined was re-shaped by real life and unrealized purpose. And God was there all along the way making space for something wonderful to happen.

Chicken Mull Watkinsville First Christian Church 1972-2022

In 1972 Chicken Mull started behind the Watkinsville First Christian Church as a fundraiser for the church. It was such a big hit, that (the Christian Men's Fellowship) by a few men decided to do it again the next year. To name a few of the men that wanted to do this was: Hot Thomas, Ed Harris, Leroy Marshall, Albert Smith, Jim Booth, and Homer Hansford.

The mull was small at first but grew from 5 black pots to 36 later. They would sell a quart for \$5.00 and give the money after expenses to the community for people in need.

When the Mull got so big (the Christian Women's Fellowship) would help to pick the meat off the bones.

We need to thank all the Christian Men's Fellowship and Christian Women's Fellowship for all of their work over the years, that made this project such a wonderful reality. This has been a long running 50 years. So, watch for this year's Mull and thank all who will work again on Dec. 3^{rd.}

Maybe we can do it for 50 more years.


Thurs, Dec. 8 - 6:00 PM "Blue Christmas" Service
