ACTS update: 2022

A total of 1558 families were served in 2022. There was a total of 4869 family members.

ACTS continues to receive donations from Trader Joe's three times each week. They donate good fruits, veggies, breads, and meats.... also eggs.

ACTS is now purchasing all the turkeys and hams we distribute at holidays with Antioch and North Oconee Rotary going 150 Fixings Bags.

A storage building, a floor cleaner machine, and freezer were purchased. Gift cards were purchased from Bell's, Walmart, and Kroger to also help clients purchase gas, etc.

Thank you to Leo and our ladies for volunteering each week.

Annual ACTS Board Meeting Update

ACTS has a total of 493 clients on file with 296 active clients who can come in once per month for food, clothing, and household items.

Currently, ACTS is in good shape financially and the Outreach Committee voted to lower our Church donation but will continue to volunteer because fewer churches are able to serve.

Only 16 churches made donations to ACTS in 2022.

Our Closet ladies worked approximately 864 hours, and most are from FCCW.

Disciples Women

The Disciples Women meet on March 27, 2023. We opened with the DW Prayer with 12 Members present. Refreshments were provided by Sheila Hunter and Connie Wheeler. "Heart Matters" April 2023 Sheila Hunter, Minister

Easter is known as a "moveable feast" in the Christian calendar year. It floats to different Sundays each year. Jesus was said to rise from the dead on the first Sunday after the first full moon of spring. Its anniversary depends more on the spring season and the moon than the numerical date on the calendar. In 2023, Easter is on April 9.

The scripture story from John 20: 8 -9 reads as following:

"Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, *and he saw and believed*; for as <u>yet they did not understand</u> the scripture, that he must rise from the dead."

For the early followers of Jesus, the beginning point of their Christian witness was the Easter event. The first ones to the tomb responded to their discovery of mystery. Over and over the disciples shared the story of the early morning experience.

There was something in the story of resurrection and Easter that reached to the deepest parts of their hearts and minds. In the resurrection God gave a miracle of love and forgiveness that brings them to faith and to doubt. It is at the crossroads of both faith and doubt that the disciples grew into being witness and encouragers of the story of God's love. It was the beginning of sharing the good news!

Do we understand the meaning of Easter? Do we believe in Easter?

- The following may offer some thoughts to help answer the above questions, borrowed from the writings of SALT, an online lectionary commentary:
- For those who despair that death-dealing powers have the upper hand: *fear not*. Easter means God ultimately is and will be victorious over the powers of death.
- For those who feel isolated and lonely: *fear not*. Easter means we are all together in the risen Body of Christ, even if we're physically unable to gather.
- For those who despair that our guilt is too great for God to forgive *fear not*. Easter means God has cleared all accounts, liberating humanity from shame, reconciling us to God and each other as God's children.
- For those who despair amid pain and anguish: *take heart*. You are not alone: Jesus suffers with you in solidarity and companionship, and Easter means you will rise with him.
- For those who despair over a world filled with hate, violence, and scapegoating: *be encouraged*. In Christ's passion, God has taken the place of the scapegoat to highlight and transform humanity's violent ways and Easter means God one day will overcome violence.

Easter is known as a "moveable feast" in the Christian calendar year. For us, Easter means God enters our lives with love and forgiveness.
