# World Café Event at FCC Watkinsville June 11, 2023


Lunch and learn from one another after church. (Pizza, dessert, and drinks provided).

## Board Minutes for March 13, 2023

<u>Members Present</u>, Ann Smith, Rosa Hall, Roger Smith, Ray Watson, Pam Crawford, Mary Lillie Watson, Wayne McTyre, Steve Hansford, Michelle Greenwall, Bill Hunt, Tommy Branch, Cathy Moorehead, Joan Taylor, Gina Hansford, and Rev. Sheila Hunter.

Elaine McTyre was also present.

<u>Call to Order</u>: Chair Ann Smith called the meeting to order and Rev. Sheila Hunter provided an opening prayer.

Prayer Concerns: Prayers concerns were shared and uplifted in prayer.

Minutes: On motion by Cathy Moorehead and second by Pam Crawford, Minutes of the February 13, 2023 meeting were approved as submitted.

Minister's Report: Rev. Sheila Hunter presented her monthly report for February 2023. She is preparing for the baptism of Elizabeth and Ella Tyre on Sunday, March 26<sup>th</sup> as well as the Palm Sunday and Easter celebrations.

#### Committee Reports:

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Cathy Moorehead said regular Sunday School classes will be held on Easter Sunday.

OUTREACH – Pam Crawford reported \$150 was donated to Family Promise; the profit from the Fat Tuesday pancake supper will be sent to Food for Kids; Week of Compassion brought in \$5,811; and, a goal of \$500 has been set for the Easter Offering.

She explained that ACTS is financially stable right now and requested amending the amount given to them annually from \$2,400 to \$1,200. By unanimous consent, the Board agreed to reduce the amount given to ACTS to \$1,200 annually with the remaining \$1,200 to be placed in the line-item budget for Miscellaneous expenditures. This is a line-item change only and will not affect the Outreach Committee's overall budget.

PROPERTY & MAINTENANCE – Wayne McTyre said the fire extinguishers have been checked and updated as needed. An inspection of the elevator is scheduled for next month.

WORSHIP – Mary Lillie Watson reported the Worship Committee has discussed a Sunrise Service on Easter Sunday, a new member reception after church on April 16<sup>th</sup> and an outdoor Worship Service on April 30<sup>th</sup>.

DEACONS –Michelle Greenwall said the Deacons are preparing for the upcoming reception for the family of Ann Hunt. She also noted there is a list on the bulletin board for volunteers to sign up for upcoming church services.

DISCIPLE WOMEN – Joan Taylor reported the Disciple Women met on February 26th. Several projects were discussed for consideration including donations for cleaning supplies to Camp Christian, meals for Disciples on Campus and Lydia's Place and new or "good used" towels for ACTS.

CMF – Steve Hansford reported the CMF met on March 6<sup>th</sup>. Mayor Brian Broderick was the guest speaker.

Devotion and Communion: Bill Hunt provided a devotion, followed by Communion.

<u>New Business</u>: Elaine McTyre explained the Church is having major problems with internet and streaming services. AT&T is the current provider and they have not been able to solve the many issues that are occurring. She presented three proposals for the Board's consideration. The Board discussed the proposals and on motion by Bill Hunt and second by Wayne McTyre, voted unanimously to proceed with Option 1 from Spectrum Business Services.

Rosa Hall requested information for the Chalice by March 31st.

Adjournment: Chair Ann Smith delivered a Closing Prayer.

Pastoral Relations Review: Chair Ann Smith called for the Pastoral Relations Review. Discussion followed.

Call to Order: Chair Ann Smith called the meeting to order and provided an opening prayer.

Chair Ann Smith stated the reason for the called meeting was to report Rev. Sheila Hunter has decided to retire from Minister of our church. She then read the resignation letter Rev. Hunter had previously submitted to the Personnel Committee on March 28th. Copies of the letter were given to each Board member.
