"Easter" by Joyce Kilmer

The air is like a butterfly
With frail blue wings.
The happy earth looks at the sky
And sings.





It is a simple little poem, and it could be named almost anything - butterfly, blue wings, spring, sing - there are so many options. This poem is named "Easter." For Joyce Kilmer, God and Jesus are essential in some way to these images and descriptions, these feelings and visions of new life that we experience every year. If there is a foundation to Christian faith, perhaps it is that there is no life, old or new, without God. If there is something particular about the Christian faith, it is that we understand and experience the God of life through Jesus. And perhaps our annual Easter lesson is that death, the death of a person or a dream, a business, a community or an idea, even our own death, is not an end, and certainly not THE end. At most it is an interlude anticipating new life. Good Friday is the doorway to Easter.

I love this little poem entitled "Easter." I love the fresh-eyed view of "air." In the Bible, the words for "air", "breath", and "spirit" are so closely related. More often than not, the same word is used for each of these, the more specific meaning being clarified by the story around it. And if not the same word, they certainly share the same root. It is something like *ruakh* in Hebrew, and *pneuma* in Greek.

How do the fresh eyes of Easter help us to "see" <u>ruakh</u> or <u>pneuma</u> anew? Keep pondering. I know, the absurdity of seeing "air" takes some work, some imagining to embrace.

And then there is that second line. We are a singing church. As we "look" with Easter eyes, Church, what will we sing? What is the good news? What is love that has to be shared? What is the healing that can't be held back? What is the welcome that must be offered? What is our joy we cannot contain? What, Church, will our Easter voices sing?
